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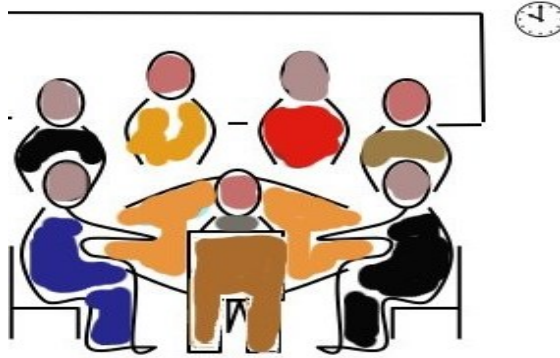

Ten Principles of Wraparound

1. Family Voice & Choice
2. Team Based
3. Natural Supports
4. Collaboration
5. Community Based
6. Culturally Competent
7. Individualized
8. Strengths Based
9. Outcome Based
10. Persistence

What is Wraparound?

A team based planning process for youth with complex needs and their families designed to help improve outcomes for youth so that they can live in their homes and communities and realize their hopes and dreams.



What happens in Wraparound?

- A team of individuals who are relevant to the well-being of your child (family members, service providers, school staff, community members, and natural supports) will be developed;
- This team will collaboratively develop and implement an individualized plan of care, monitor the efficacy of the plan, and work towards success over time;
- The plan of care will address your child's and your family's needs while being family centered, strength based and culturally relevant;
- This team will meet frequently to evaluate strategies and interventions within the plan of care;
- You and your family will have the opportunity learn a specific set of skills to carry forth the wraparound process within your community once the formal process is complete.

Benefits of Wraparound

- Instills hope in families
- Develops family skills
- Strengthens connection between parent and child
- Increases resilience in families
- Bridges families to natural supports in their community



Who is eligible for Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISE)?

children/youth up to 21 years of age who

- are Medicaid Eligible;
- meet Access to Care standards;
- have complex emotional/behavioral needs which warrant an intensive level of services and supports;
- and who agree along with their caregiver/guardian, to participate in the process.

Who is eligible for MIDD Wraparound?

children/youth up to 21 years of age with

- complex emotional/behavioral needs;
- who are multi-system involved;
- with system partners willing to participate in the process;
- and who agree along with their caregiver/guardian, to participate in the process.
